Low-cost spay/neuter center opens in Nacogdoches

Nacogdoches has one of the highest cat and dog euthanasia rates in Texas, according to O'Malley PET. Euthanasia of healthy, adoptable animals happens because there are many more animals born than there are potential homes.

Nacogdoches desperately needs a low-cost spay and neuter clinic. The O'Malley PET (Preventing Euthanasia Together) is taking on this challenge by opening a clinic for low income pet owners. It is located in a house which recently opened its doors to both cats and dogs for low-cost spay, neuter and vaccination. The clinic is located at 611 North Fredonia St.

The organization relies on a dedicated group of volunteers, donations and a special fund to keep the nonprofit house stocked with all the necessities for running the clinic.

In support of the O'Malley PET organization, Judy Boynton and Joe Knobloch began a fund in memory of their much-loved two dachshund pups Rex and Sammy. One hundred percent of the fund pays for medical fees, with donations provide for spay and neuter of pets whose owners require financial assistance.
