As the medical director of the Nacogdoches Animal Shelter, Blount donates countless hours to her clients and her patients.

She also volunteers her time assisting other practitioners, mentoring veterinary students and even providing guidance for high school and

college students who are interested in veterinary medicine.

A graduate of Texas A&M University, Blount also works as an adjunct professor at various universities and as a small animal practitioner at several veterinary clinics in East Texas, including Eastex Veterinary Clinic in Nacogdoches and Southwood Drive Animal Clinic in Lufkin.

email listserves, Blount has also done a great deal to bring Texas veterinarians together as friends and colleagues, extending her commitment to veterinary medicine to benefit her veterinary colleagues, the citizens of Nacogdoches and the animals of East Texas.
